
## **Final**


study. I spent the whole 6 hours with my friend studying. But it was hard.

My host mother, Sharon Cloran, is from England and has an awesome relationship with her husband's family. So mom and I would go to family gatherings every holiday. In Cloran family, there are Grandma, Aunt Teresa and Uncle Daryl, their sons Daryl and Bret, Aunt Hellen and Uncle Mike, their two daughters Nikki, and Christi, Aunt Mary-Ann and Uncle Ray, their children Kate, Pat, and Maddie, and Uncle Denny. Aunt Teresa and Uncle Daryl have a house in Newport, New Jersey, and mom and I were invited to spend the Memorial Day weekend in Newport. The house is called Maggie's Place and is the oldest house in the town. Aunt Teresa and Uncle Daryl bought the house 15 years ago and added more rooms but kept some parts too. Welcome to the Narragansett Bay Research Reserve! With the big excitement with her voice, we could realize that we've arrived to the Prudence Island, the third largest island in Narragansett Bay in the U.S. state of Rhode Island. Prudence Island only has population of 88 and it was very interesting to peek into their island life. I was able to travel to Prudence Island because of my new host sister Zoey, who was part of the Girl Scout. Girl Scout had activities planned in Prudence Island and Zoey wanted me to go with her, and it was absolutely amazing experience. My real host family planned going to Spain during spring break, so I had to find someone to stay with. That's how I met Zoey, and I am so excited to spend rest of the week with her.

6 am, alarm clock rang. It was little early for vacation, but nothing mattered because I was pumped to go to the Prudence Island. The only thing we had to bring was our lunch and bug spray. I was worried about ticks because Zoey told me there were lots of ticks. So, I almost took a shower with a bug spray;) We had to hurry because the ferry left at 8 am, and to the harbor was about an hour drive. Grabbing a breakfast from Dunkin, we were all ready.

I was very surprised when I saw the Prudence Island school house. It was one room building with cafeteria and playground outside. It was built during 1896 by Captain Halsey Chase, and it remained till today. The woman told us that there are only 6 students going to this school, and we might think this is so small but she told it actually is very many students. I wondered if they will learn same stuffs as us, and they did. They learned all same stuffs like Algebra, Chemistry, and such. Walking about a mile from the school, we arrived to the division wall. In the mid 1630's, a large boulder (division rock) was used as a survey point to divide the island in half, with Roger Williams owning the northern half and governor John Winthrop owning the southern half. That division rock that runs the length is now known as the division wall.

All of us wanted to do save natural features for the last (best for the last), and so finishing up with Farnham farm and historical cemetery, we head to our last step. Prudence Island is very purified place since not many people lives in. Also, approximately 85% of the island is protected from development. Even though the beach walk in Bay Avenue was about 2 miles of walking, I will say it was the best part of the day. It was my first time being this close to nature since I live in the city and everything I say there made me wordless. It was gorgeous. During the whole walking time, it was so hot and also hard to walk because of undeveloped roads, but I will never forget this awesome day in Prudence Island. Thanks Zoey!

## **Carnival**



The season of a carnival is back! A lot of schools and malls set up the carnival, lasting for about a month. For those of you who don't exactly know what's there at a carnival, let me briefly explain some things you will see if you go.

First, all different kinds of rides. These rides might be the first you will see: Ferris wheel, Cliffhanger, fun slide, Hurricane, Mini roller coaster, Reverse bungees, Roter, Top Spin, Tornado, Turbo Drop, and so on. To ride them, you need tickets, which can be purchased at a ticket booth. One ticket is a dollar, but they sell 24 tickets for 20 dollars. So we got two packs of 24 tickets and split them up. Most of the time, one ride cost four tickets. So we went on to three rides total, Roter, Tornado, and Ferris wheel. A rotor is a ride that is a large upright barrel and rotates. As it spins, the riders feel stuck to the wall because of the force of friction due to centrifugal force. Because of that force, the riders might feel dizzy after getting off of the ride. A tornado is a ride that spins while the riders can also turn it using the

handle that is in the middle of the car. The center tilts at 20 degrees, moving the cars up and down. As soon as the ride started to move, we all spin the car so bad that our arms were all tired by the end of the ride. At last, we went on a Ferris wheel, a wheel with multiple passenger-carrying cars attached to the





rim so that as the wheel turns, the cars are upright. We waited to get dark, and then got on the Ferris wheel because up top, it looked beautiful.

Second, the games. Unlike the rides, you play games by paying in cash. Types of the game vary from throwing darts to shooting games. As we were walking down the street full of games, we decided to play a crossbow game. If we get a bull-seye of the target, we can choose whatever stuffed animals or characters we want. We all went once, and Jiyoung and I almost got the target but missed it. It was a bit disappointing that it was so close, but we moved on. Then we went to a dart game. Adrian threw the dart and popped all the balloons he needed, so he got a little stuffed animal.
