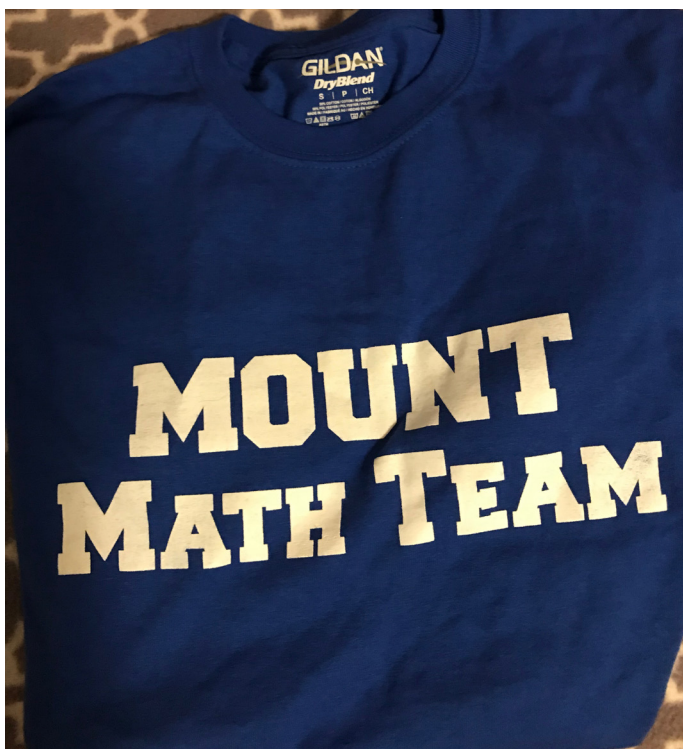


Rhode Island Math League



Since Freshman year, I was part of Mount Saint Charles Math team. I have to be honest - I was never good at or liked math at all. The only reason I joined was just like others, "to look good on college application". It was interesting though, because the concept math competition was not something I was familiar with; only encounter that I made with math was math class in school and outside tutoring. I remember my freshman year Geometry class, our teacher was asking if anyone was interested being part of the math team. I felt nerdy and embarrassing to raise my hand, so went to see her after school for info. It was very funny because my class joked about being on math team when Ms. Degnan brought up but half of our class was there getting permission slips from her. For example if practice problem for Algebra II covers about synthetic division, that is something you will see on the meet.

The genuine fun of the math meet is the team round. And that is still one of my reasons why I love being part of the team. Other rounds are nothing to different from solving boring math problems except accuracy of your answer matters while deciding whether

your school wins or not. Also you have 10 minutes given to solve 3 problems. More correct answers your school have made, more chances of having higher score are made, which means victory. Something unique and attracting about the team round is that you get to discuss the problems with your teammates. When there are 20 students attending the meet, the coach usually divides us into five different teams regardless of your grade. So my team might have freshman along with senior. It is very nice because I feel like the team is composed of various age group tending to have higher creativity than team of same grade. I always learn new ways and approaches to solve the problem by talking with my team. Also, it creates a bonding moment with the team since we only have 10 minutes to solve 5 different problems from any topic so that we try to make the most out of limited time.

Our math team has done very well for past years by placing first or second from state. I haven't been selected as representative competent, yet but I am hoping maybe in senior year, I will be able



to represent our school math division and score well. For someone who wants to join academic clubs like math team but worried of what others might think, I want to tell you one thing- it can never hurt you. The earlier you start, the more you learn! So today, why don't you explore what options your school has and join the team? You never know, you might end up with something you would never think is going to happen- I LOVE MATH!

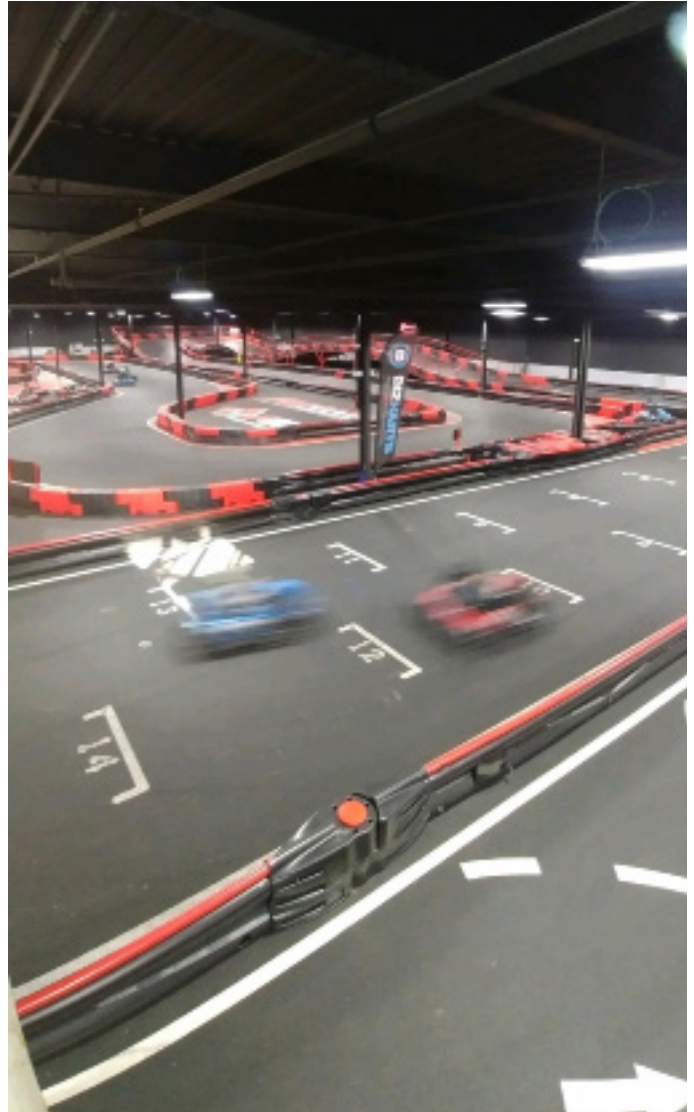

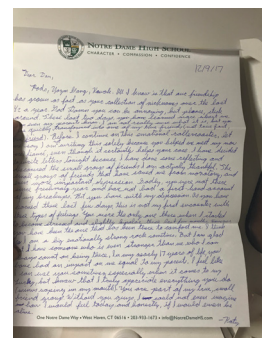

How to make your very own slime

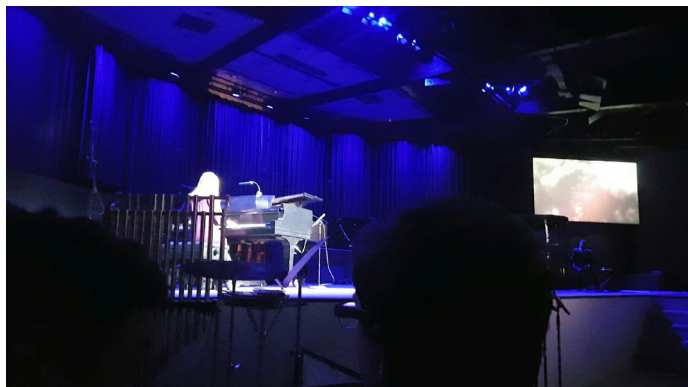
-based on using half of the glue bottle

1. You need a container, water bottle, elmer's glue, borax or temporary borax, something to mix with, and decoration of your taste.
2. Inside a container, pour half of the glue.
3. Drop 3 drops of water
4. Put a big pinch of baking powder
5. Mix them all together until you see the gooey texture
6. As you see the mixture is not a pure liquid anymore, add about 3 long drops of contact solution
7. Continue to mix your solution and add contact solution to make it harder.
8. Lift up with your hands and check if your slime is ready to decorate
9. Decorate your slime of your taste and keep mixing them with your hands
10. YOUR SLIME IS READY!

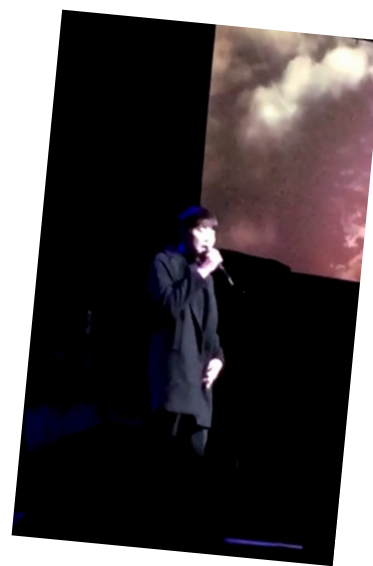
was really nervous and that made me feel worse.

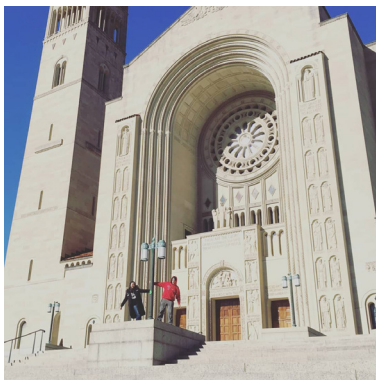

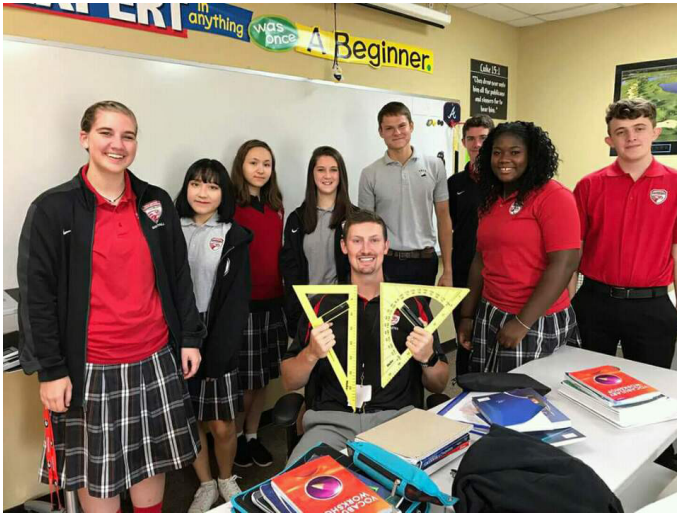
guess who might win.

Orange Is the New Black is an American comedy-drama web television series created by Jenji Kohan for Netflix. The series is based on Piper Kerman's memoir, *Orange Is the New Black: My Year in a Women's Prison* (2010), about her experiences a minimum-security federal prison. It is combination of comedy, crime and drama. It features this interesting plot : convicted of a decade old crime of transporting drug money to an ex-girlfriend, normally law abiding Piper Chapman is sentenced to a year and a half behind bars to face the reality of how life changing prison can really be. Before explaining all details, it is important to know that this TV show is rated R, therefore contains lots of violent, sexual, and brutal scenes. Despite it all, the show still contains very moving scenes, showing great friendship, beautiful love and lament stories

behind prisoners that explain why they ended up in the prison. The show is supposed to process in the focus of the story of the main protagonist Piper Chapman, and her ex-girlfriend and current fiancé, Alex Vause, however, it has become the show without any main protagonist as the seasons go forward. Each character is so attractive, funny and distinct, and you will be allured to them as soon as you start watching this show. It is incredibly entertaining to watch it and find out all the stories of the prisoners as well. Some prisoners have pretty shocking past and some have really sad and painful past that unavoidably forced them to become prisoners.

Not only the show features lots of comical, interesting, sad and touching scenes, but it also criticizes lots of social problems within the United States. For example, it vividly shows the conflict among different racial groups. In the prison, there are five distinct groups : Whites, Blacks, Hispanic, Golden Girls (Elderlies), and another group consisted of other races. They always fight and throw harsh words at each other. In addition to this, it reflects the reality of prison life including gay or lesbian sex, drugs, poverties, corruptions of politics and business and privatization of federal organization. The show lets us know the dark side of America.

The quality of this show is demonstrated by pretty much every website, video and post on online.
